As the only Nurse member on the ALC (others were lawyers, business leaders, and community advocates), I volunteered each legislative session to testify on HIV/AIDS bills pending before Maryland's Legislature (House and Senate) in the State Capitol. Each proposed law was scrutinized for its impact on the rights of persons with – or at risk for – HIV or AIDS, access to health care services, and social justice. Crucial legislative issues included funding access to HIV antibody counseling & testing sites, mandatory names reporting of persons testing positive for HIV infection, mandatory HIV testing of healthcare providers, and requiring basic education on HIV/AIDS for Maryland's healthcare workforce. (1992 – 1995)

Maryland Senate Bill 559: Nurses – HIV/AIDS Education. I co-authored a legislative bill to establish a continuing education (CEU) requirement for a one-time HIV/AIDS course for licensed nurses in the State of Maryland. The course was comprised of three hours of HIV/AIDS prevention, transmission, care/treatment, legal/ethical issues, and psychosocial implications. The final version – Bill 559: Nurses – HIV/AIDS Education – was sponsored by Senator Paula Hollinger, a nurse legislator in the **Maryland State Senate**. (1993)
