A complex systems perspective based on the values of inclusion, diversity, and person-directedness underlies my work. It focuses on social work's foundational perspective of *person-in-environment*. Current activities address how location and self-organization affect addictions, human trafficking and services to persons with disabilities. Through the application of network thinking, social innovation and computational methods, current activities include

- Applying social innovation and social physics at the client level to address the built environment, urban design, transit, and service delivery issues through spatial statistics
- Developing social program evaluation tools using complex adaptive systems theory
- Facilitating a complexity theory/person-in environment orientation in social work education
- Understanding the non-linear processes - including self-organizing criticality, flocks, and swarms, and songs of protest - leading to the emergence of social programs and movements to move the field beyond an ecosystems approach
